

SHARED SOCIETY IN ISRAEL (43%)**The Abraham Initiatives****\$25,000**

The Abraham Initiatives works to advance coexistence, equality and cooperation among Israel's Jewish and Arab citizens by creating and operating large-scale initiatives, cultivating strategic grassroots projects and conducting public education and advocacy that promote its vision of shared citizenship and opportunity for all of Israel's citizens.

Alliance for Middle East Peace**\$25,000**

The Alliance for Middle East Peace is a coalition of non-governmental organizations that promote people-to-people coexistence and reconciliation between Israelis and Palestinians, Arabs and Jews in the Middle East.

Bokra**\$5,000**

Bokra's goals are to build a better future and be a sane voice for the future generation and for an Israeli society that is free from racism.

Givat Haviva Center for Shared Society**\$25,000**

Givat Haviva's Center for Shared Society works to empower the Arab minority as a key to creating a more peaceful and tolerant society and brings Arab and Jewish youth together for co-existence programs.

Hagar Association: Jewish-Arab Education for Equality**\$25,000**

HAGAR: Jewish-Arab Education for Equality is a springboard for social change through its bilingual, multicultural school and community programming. Hand in Hand operates seven integrated, bilingual, multicultural Jewish-Arab schools for Jewish, Muslim and Christian children in pre-K through high school, with the vision of creating a new model of integrated education.

Have You Seen the Horizon Lately?**\$25,000**

"Have You Seen the Horizon Lately?" is an Israeli initiative that promotes Jewish-Arab political partnership and operates Israel's only joint Jewish-Arab emergency relief center.

INJAZ – Center for Professional Arab Local Governance in Israel**\$5,000**

INJAZ helps develop Arab local governance by building the management capacity of local councils and municipalities.

Inter-Agency Task Force on Israeli Arab Issues**\$15,000**

Inter-Agency Task Force on Israeli Arab Issues works to inform the American Jewish community on majority/minority relations in Israel and increase awareness of economic, educational and social service weaknesses facing Israeli Arab communities.

Israel Policy Forum**\$10,000**

Israel Policy Forum works to shape the discourse and mobilize support among American Jewish leaders and U.S. policymakers for the realization of a viable two-state solution.

Israel Religious Action Center**\$25,000**

The Israel Religious Action Center strives to advance religious freedom and pluralism, tolerance, social justice and civil liberties in Israel.

J Street Education Fund**\$75,000**

J Street was founded to promote meaningful American leadership to end the Arab-Israeli and Israeli-Palestinian conflicts peacefully and diplomatically. It supports a new direction for American policy in the Middle East and a broad public and policy debate about the U.S. role in the region.

KANAF/Alliance for Israel's Democracy**\$150,000**

KANAF is an integrating center for philanthropic resources for strengthening, building up, and protecting democracy in Israel.

Neve Shalom/What al Salam Primary School**\$25,000**

The Neve Shalom/Wahat al-Salam Primary School includes bilingual, multicultural nursery level (depending on yearly demand), kindergarten, and primary school for approximately 300 Jewish and Arab children.

New Israel Fund**\$35,000**

New Israel Fund is the leading organization committed to equality and democracy for all Israelis.

New Story Leadership**\$10,000**

New Story Leadership is a Washington-based nonprofit that brings emerging Israeli and Palestinian changemakers to D.C. each summer to work together on Capitol Hill and in civil society institutions.

P.E.F. Israel Endowment Funds**\$5,000**

P.E.F. Israel Endowment Funds is a US-based 501(c)(3) public charity that supports approved charitable projects and organizations in Israel, focusing on education, health, research, welfare for vulnerable groups (like the handicapped, children, and women), and fostering understanding between Jewish and Arab communities.

Parents Circle - Families Forum**\$5,000**

The Parents Circle – Families Forum (PCFF) is a joint Israeli-Palestinian organization of over 600 families, all of whom have lost an immediate family member to the ongoing conflict.

Peaceplayers International – Middle East**\$5,000**

PeacePlayers International engenders meaningful interaction between Arab and Jewish children in Israel and the West Bank through joint basketball activities and life skills sessions which take place regularly throughout the entire school year.

ROPES: The Regional Organization for Peace, Economics & Security**\$25,000**

The Regional Organization for Peace, Economics & Security (ROPES) seeks to revive momentum toward a historic Israeli-Palestinian peace accord. SOCIAL JUSTICE & CIVIC AFFAIRS (24%)**Bread for the City****\$100,000**

Bread for the City provides legal, medical and social services, and emergency assistance to impoverished children and adults in Washington, D.C.

Bright Beginnings**\$35,000**

Bright Beginnings is a child development center for homeless children, ages six months to five years, whose families live in shelters and transitional housing in the District of Columbia.

Coalition for Nonprofit Housing & Economic Development**\$25,000**

CNHED's mission is to strengthen and support the ability of nonprofit community development organizations to improve the quality of life in the District of Columbia's neighborhoods through advocacy, information sharing, training, capacity building, research and communications.

Community of Hope**\$35,000**

Community of Hope creates opportunities for low-income families in Washington, DC, including those experiencing homelessness, to achieve good health, a stable home, family-sustaining income, and hope.

DC Action**\$50,000**

Local Initiatives Support Corporation**\$50,000**

The Washington, DC LISC program is a site of the Local Initiatives Support Corporation, the largest community development support organization in the country. Its mission is to help community-based organizations create healthy neighborhoods that are good places to live, work, raise children and conduct business.

Miriam's Kitchen**\$125,000**
